N.B: Members must obtain written introduction prior to visiting.

Message to Members

The game of golf depends on tradition and long established custom. A golf club is a conservative institution and this conservatism should extend to the choice of dress and standard of conduct on the course and in the clubhouse.

It cannot be too strongly emphasised that the fundamental rule is consideration to fellow members. To know the rules and observe the etiquette of golf is not only a tribute to you but also a tribute to the club to which you belong.

Under the rules you are obliged to report any breaches of the rules of golf or club rules to club management or appropriate club officials.

CLUB BY-LAWS

The following are the playing rights and practical application of various categories.

Full Playing Men

7 days per week. In practice, any time except Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday mornings when times are allocated for Muriwai lady club members and any time the course is reserved for a special event.

Full Playing Ladies

7 days per week. In practice, any time except Saturday a.m, when tee allocation has been allotted for Muriwai lady members or when the course is reserved for a special event. On Saturday lady members either play in the allotted tee times or after the main club field.

Weekday Members

Monday to Friday except on Public Holidays, Saturday and Sunday, apart from those events stipulated by the committee or when the course is reserved for a special event.

Restricted (Pay to Play)

7 days outside club competition times, allows the member an NZ golf handicap to play in club Scrambles, does not entitle the member to play in club trophy events. The member is required to pay a course charge for each game.

9-Hole Ladies

Tuesday 9:00am and on other days the course and tee times are available. In practice play on days other than Tuesday club day is at the discretion of the Golf Shop.

Junior (J16) 14-16 years of age

As per Full Playing members, to participate in club events playing group must contain one adult member.

Junior (J18) 17-18 years of age.

As per Full Playing members.

Junior (J21) 19-21 years of age. As per Full Playing members.

Junior (J23) 22-23 years of age. As per Full Playing members.

Junior Restricted (JR) 10-13 years of age
7 days per week outside main club times and with adult supervision.

The General Manager, Starter or appropriate Match Committee may on the day and at their sole discretion allow members or green fee players to start in times allocated to a particular category of membership if times are not being utilised.

Matches

The match committee controls play on the course and have sole jurisdiction in all club competitions.

Match Eligibility

No member shall be eligible to participate in any competition, should their subscriptions remain unpaid one month after the due date, unless arrangements for payment have been confirmed through the General Manager's office in accordance with procedures laid down by the Board of Management.

Rules

The rules of play shall be the rules of the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews and with the local rules printed on the official score card or as noted on the official notice board. The recommended rules of the North Harbour Golf Association and New Zealand Golf Incorporated shall be supplementary to these by-laws.

Slow Play

If players fail to keep their place in the field and lose one clear hole behind those playing immediately in front of them, the players following them have the right to 'play through'. The players at fault must therefore:- (a) make up lost ground without delay, or:- (b) call through the players following.

If they fail to do this then the players following **MUST** indicate they are exercising their right to play through.

Club Events

- All finals except club championships shall be played over 18 holes.
- In club competitions all matches and rounds shall be played within the dates specified in the programme or shown on the draw sheet. For the purpose of deciding default matches, the player or side present and prepared to play at the allocated time, shall be declared the winner by default. N.B. Dispensation shall be at the discretion of the Match Committee.
- In the case of dispute, the decision of the Match Committee shall be final.
- All entry fees must be paid before playing in competitions.
- Entries for drawn match play events will close the Saturday prior to the event and/or at the discretion of the Match Committee.

- When playing a match play event you are not able to enter the scramble of the day. You can enter holes in two, jackpot and hole in one. The events covered by this ruling are Chauval Trophy, Kirkup Bowl, Deffee Trophy, Lew Moore Trophy, Mayes Summer Cup, and match play championships.
- Men's tee policy. Monday to Friday White tees. Saturday club events, as per event programme. Saturday casual play White tees. Sunday as per Event Programme Book, casual play, White tees.
Blue tees (Championship course) will be used for Monthly Medal, Senior & Intermediate club Stroke and Match Play Championships. Senior interclub Pennants and other events as published or directed by the Match Committee.
Players can request to play the Blue tees (if available) on a non-blue tee day, subject to the following,
 - (a) Player must have a handicap of 15 or less.
 - (b) Players must not delay the field or cause slow play.
 - (c) Players must seek permission to use the Blue tees from the Golf Shop starter and approval is at the discretion of the starter or club manager.

Starting Sheet

In fairness to all, players should not reserve times unless they are reasonably certain of playing at the time stated. Match play starting times will be allocated. Duplicate entries will be dispatched at the starter's discretion. If it is necessary to cancel or amend your starting time, it is common courtesy to notify the club, prior to your allotted time. Players must report to the starter at least 10 minutes prior to the designated starting time and be ready to play when called. Penalties are provided in the rules of golf, Rule 6.3 for failing to start on time.

Course Priority

All players must report to the golf shop before commencing play. All play is to commence from the 1st tee unless otherwise instructed by the golf shop starter or club official.

Match play competition shall have the right of way. Play shall normally be groups of 4. A single player has no standing on the course and shall stand aside to allow groups of 2, 3 or 4 to play through. No playing group will consist of more than 4 players unless participating in an authorised event.

Members tee priority for club events during the club season: Wednesday 8:15 – 10:30am; Saturday up to 12:00pm; Sunday up to 10:30am. Ladies time allocation during the club season Wednesday 9:30am – 10:00am, Saturday 10:32 – 11:04am. Sunday subject to event and numbers entered.

The president and the captains shall have the right to invite guests and have priority on the tee.

Members' priority times not used can be allocated to green fee players subject to the approval of the General Manager.

Course Closure

Prior to play the Manager, Match Committee or their deputies, may close the course. During play the Manager or Match Committee of the day can cancel, suspend play and/or close the course.

Suspension of play: 1 blast of the siren.

Resumption of play: 2 blasts of the siren.

Cancellation of play: 3 blasts of the siren.

Guest of Member

Members are entitled to invite guests who will be charged at the ruling guest of member's rate as displayed in the golf shop. All green fees must be paid prior to the commencement of play. During the season and the main club times members are entitled to 1 guest. Outside these times members are entitled up to 3 guests, at the guest of members rate. Variation to invited guest rules must have prior approval of the General Manager. Members shall be responsible for any invited guest.

Score Cards

Players are responsible for ensuring their score cards are completed correctly, signed and attested. The score card must contain name, player ID number, course played and date. The event played on the day must be marked on the card including the partner's card if playing in a team's event. All competition cards must be handed in immediately on completion of the round before entering the clubhouse or changing rooms. Both stroke play and match play score cards must be returned. The handicapper will reject cards of incomplete rounds at their discretion in accordance with the NZ Handicapping Rules. Failure to comply will result in exclusion from the event and/or disqualification.

Handicaps

Players are requested to hand in their card properly completed after each round with full detail. Under the present handicapping system this is essential. New players must complete at least five cards before a handicap index can be allotted.

Handicap cards from outside clubs. Members visiting and playing at other clubs in New Zealand should leave score cards at the club visited for processing on the NZ Golf online handicapping system. Ensure the following information is clearly marked on the card: * name, * club ID and membership number, * date, * course played, * adjusted Gross score, * signed by both the player and marker.

If this information is not supplied then the card could be rejected for handicapping.

Ladies Golf Section

Ladies golf shall be administrated according to the special standing rules for that purpose, a copy of which shall always be available (a) the ladies locker room notice board (b) the General Manager's office.

Motorised Assistance

Motorised assistance can be used in all club competitions except club championships where a current medical certificate is required for a permanent medical condition only. A certificate will not be honoured for fitness discrepancies, e.g. sore foot, ingrown toenail, sprained ankle, etc. In this context 'motorised assistance' refers to golf carts and motor bikes and does not include battery-powered trundlers.

Golf Carts

The Muriwai Golf Club owns and maintains motorised golf carts for hire. Privately owned golf carts can be used on the course with prior approval. A course maintenance fee of \$10 a round will be applied.

Sharing of Golf Clubs Prohibited

Every player must possess a set of golf clubs. Sharing of clubs is not permitted except in club competitions and only in accordance with the provisions of Rule 4-4b.

Collection & Purchase of Golf Balls

Prior to searching for and collecting golf balls on the course for resale, permission must be obtained from the General Manager. Golf balls gathered from the course must be offered to the Golf Shop for first refusal of purchase. The sole right of the sale of golf balls is the Muriwai Golf Club Golf Shop. Golf balls must not be purchased from any unauthorised person on or in the vicinity of the golf course.

Dress

Members must observe the dress rules as displayed on the notice boards, both on the course and in the lounge.

Kitchen and Bar Areas

These areas are strictly private and members must not enter except by invitation.

Children

Under the age of 10 years are not permitted on the course unless under adult members supervision. Children other than junior members are not permitted on the course or in the clubhouse unless accompanied by, or under control, of their parents and guardians.

Persons under the age of 18 are not permitted to purchase alcohol from the bar, consume alcohol, or use any gaming machines that may be on the premises.

Parking

Members are requested to park carefully and in such a manner to ensure maximum numbers may be accommodated. Members are requested to observe places reserved for officers of the club and staff. Vehicles are parked at the owners' risk. The Club accepts no responsibility for loss or damage whilst parked within the Club car park or grounds.

Course Entry and Exit

All members and visitors shall use the main club entrance situated off Coast Road.

Dogs on Course

Normally dogs are not allowed on the course, but if the occasion arises where a member or visitor has a dog, it must be on a leash and under the owner's control at all times while on the golf course.

Practice

Players practising on the course proper shall not play with more than 2 golf balls. Tees and greens shall not be used for practice. Multiple ball practice is restricted to designated areas as provided.

Club Staff

Club employees have priority on the course for maintenance and supervision purposes. Players must give way at all times. In no circumstances shall a member directly reprimand or reproach an employee of the club. All complaints relating to club management shall be in writing to the General Manager who shall submit them to the Board of Management.

Suggestions and Complaints

Suggestions are welcome. These should be in writing to the General Manager who, if required, will refer them for action to the Board of Management or appropriate sub committee. Complaints will be made in writing to the General Manager.

Members Rights

Members have the right to ensure the club's regulations and by-laws are observed. Especially by visitors and green fee players. To this extent, any member has the right to speak directly to any person seen in breach of the rules, in particular, those pertaining to misconduct, unacceptable dress standards and damage to the course and property including trespass. Any incident must be reported immediately to club management or official.

Disciplinary Policy

The Board of Management shall appoint a disciplinary committee to 'exercise discipline over members participating in events conducted by the club, or in respect of conduct reflecting unfavourable on the game or club wherever it may occur.'

Hole in One Insurance

The hole in one levy on playing members insures the member in event of scoring a hole in one achieved during a stipulated competition round in which the rules of golf have been observed. The insurance provides (a) the issue of one glass of beer; a small bottle of beer; a single glass of wine or single nip of spirits to every member playing on the course during the day the hole in one was scored. (b) To a maximum pay out home course \$150, away \$100 at any other NZ Golf (Inc) affiliated course, provided the actual cost of 'shouting' is suitably substantiated.

Subscriptions

Subscriptions are due on the 1st January and if a member has not paid in full, or made arrangement for instalment payment by 28 February then membership shall cease, ipso facto. Nevertheless, the defaulting member shall remain liable to pay overdue subscriptions or other fees.

Members who have joined under the annual cycle billing system are required to pay or make arrangements to pay their subscriptions within one month of the due date. Failure to adhere will result in the membership declared non-financial.

Resignations

Any member of the club wishing to resign must notify the General Manager in writing no later than 31 December. Failure to do so renders the member liable for the new years subscription.

Members on cycle billing are required to resign on receipt of their annual subscription renewal notice. Failure to submit the written resignation within the one-month period will render the member liable for the new years subscription.

Addresses

Every member shall advise the club administration of change of address, telephone number or e-mail address.

Warning

The playing of golf can be a dangerous pastime. Members and visitors should be aware of any golf balls hit in the wrong direction and the use of machinery on the course.

Maintenance of the course involves the use of fertilisers and sprays. All players should heed the signs when such material is being used.

Etiquette of Golf

- Members are urged to observe the etiquette of the game thus ensuring the enjoyment of the game for members and visitors.
- Walk smartly between shots and holes.
- Do not talk or move while a stroke is being made.
- Do not play a stroke until those ahead are out of range.
- Call the following group through as soon as it becomes apparent a ball cannot be readily found. Do not wait until the 5 minutes have elapsed before doing so.
- Your place in the field is directly behind the group in front **NOT** directly in front of the group behind.
- Do not leave trundlers, golf carts or motor bikes in front of the greens. Do not take them between greens and bunkers or on to any teeing ground.
- Please replace divots, repair ball marks on the green and on completion of the hole, repair spike marks.
- Rake bunkers after playing a stroke and leave the rake inside the bunker.
- Avoid practice swings on the tee.
- Motorised transport should be driven on paths, fairways and kept away from greens, surrounds, tees and the rough.
- Be conversant with the rules of golf and in particular the local rules that are in effect from time to time.

Competitions

Match Play Events. Members are requested to be aware of events, which qualify for match play to follow. If members wish to play in a match play event then their card must clearly be marked to indicate the desire to enter. Failure to do this will result in exclusion from the draw.

Members should not enter any match play event unless they are available to complete every round of the event. Once the draw for a match play event has been posted it may not be changed for any reason.

Countback Policy

- In an 18-hole competition a countback matching cards is used to determine the winner using the last 9 holes. If there is still a tie, then the last 6, then the last 3, then 18th hole are used.
- In competitions greater than 18-hole a countback matching cards is made using the last 18-hole score. If there is still a tie, then the last 9, 6, 3, or 1 hole(s) of the 18-hole score are used.
- In all cases, if the tie is then still unresolved, then a hole by hole countback of the last 9 holes starting at the 18th hole should be made. If there is still a tie after this procedure then the results shall be decided by lot.
- In handicap stroke play competition, one – half, one – third, one – sixth, etc of the course handicaps should be deducted proportionately, for example 9 holes – one half, 6 holes – one third, 3 holes – one sixth etc. *Fractions should not be disregarded.*
- If there is a multiple tee start, regardless of the starting hole, the last 9 holes, last 6 holes etc is considered to be holes 10 – 18, 13 – 18 etc.

Club Championship Match Play.

Qualifying for all grades is over the last 36 holes of the stroke play championship. Top 16 players in each grade qualify for Championship match play. A Plate Division for the second 16 will be played in each grade should the numbers be in excess of 32 players per grade. Match play games must be played on the day and at the times set by the Match Committee, dispensation to play earlier than the day and times set must be gained from the Match Committee and the opponent.

All finals must be played on the day and at the times set by the Match Committee, no dispensation will be granted.
